



## Lilla Jewel Award Application Questions

### Application Questions

1. Tell us about yourself. While reflecting on your past, please give us a brief summary of your development as an artist, especially as it relates to your social justice values. (500 words)
2. While reflecting on the present, please tell us about your current work and practice as it relates to social justice. In addition to telling us about your work, please touch on: (500 words)
  - How does your practice demonstrate art as activism?
  - How do you collaborate, partner with, and/or involve your community or other artists in your work? How does this inform your practice?
3. Is there anything you want to tell us about the future of your work, or is there anything you would like us to know that we have not asked you? (300 words)
4. You may submit up to three examples of your work that:
  - Address progressive social, racial, economic, disability, gender, and/or environmental justice issues; and
  - Are relevant to the struggles of social justice movements and communities most impacted by injustice.
5. Please keep in mind the following parameters:
  - Video work samples should be kept to a 3 - 5 minute limit.
  - Written work samples should be kept to a 3 - 5 minute reading limit; this roughly looks like 2 to 3 pages, double-sided.
  - Include one work/piece per attachment (e.g. one photo—or one YouTube link, or one poem—are considered one attachment).
    - i. For audio and video files, provide links to hosted media. When providing links, be sure to include any necessary passwords.
    - ii. For text/script samples, upload a PDF. Each sample should be a separate PDF.
